n 2023 Forest Voluntary Action Forum received funding from the Barnwood Trust to set up the Forest of Dean Digital Inclusion Collaborative.

This district-wide partnership, the first of its kind, brought together passionate people and organisations with a shared goal to break down the barriers people face in digital world and unlock the many assets available in our communities.

Over the past 18 months the Collaborative have been working together to develop centralised, accessible information and deliver projects to improve digital access for disabled and older people, those on a low income and people with mental health challenges.

The *Digital Compass* highlights the organisations involved in the collaborative, the pilot projects developed and gives helpful information on other digital inclusion groups, organisations and projects available in the Forest of Dean.

The Digital Compass had been produced thanks to Barnwood Trust's 'Digital Inclusion Fund'.

## **Virtual Sight Loss Project**

Forest Sensory Services (FSS) developed a project to address the challenge of visually impaired individuals struggling to communicate their level of vision to their support networks.



Previously, options like edited pictures or static-patterned goggles were expensive. Recognising a gap in understanding among families and friends, FSS explored ways to personalise experiences through advanced technologies such as VR/AR headsets.

The project started with Macular Degeneration and Glaucoma. By using Actual Field of Vision tests FFS have enabled users to experience a sliding scale of vision loss for each condition in virtual or real-world settings.

Accessible to those over 14 years old, the headsets are available in community groups, schools, and care homes. They can also connect to screens, allowing younger children to experience visual impairments alongside their teachers.

FFS can now offer tailored solutions to give a more personalised experience and there are plans to expand to other conditions.

**Outdoors Indoors Project**

Inspired by research demonstrating the positive impact of nature recordings on mental and emotional health, the project seeks to replicate these effects by creating a digital library of immersive films, audio recordings, and a captivating virtual reality environment. The project promises a multisensory journey into the heart of nature, crafting a comprehensive resource that caters to diverse audiences.

This ambitious pilot is making nature accessible, through the power of digital resources.

### **Hybrid Choir**

This digitally linked hybrid choir began following a request from Forest Sensory Services (FSS) service users for singing classes. Around the same time Artspace began an in-house wellbeing choir,





however service users at FSS were unable to access the Artspace building in central Cinderford due mostly to transport difficulties.

To solve this, FSS and Artspace Cinderford worked together to create the digitally linked Hybrid Choir. To enable both choirs to sing together online, a choir leader facilitates the singing at each venue in Artspace and at FFS community space.

The digital link between the choirs has also been used to record live stream rehearsals, allowing both groups and choir leaders to listen to and influence each other. FSS choir have moved towards singing with instrumentation thanks to the influence of the Artspace choir. Similarly, after listening to the FSS recordings, Lisa at the Artspace choir wrote a new song that both groups can sing together.



With 15-20 regular singers at Artspace and 9 regular singers at FSS, both groups have grown artistically and gained in confidence.

A joint performance is planned in July 2024 to a public audience of around 100 people. This will be the culmination of many hours of hard work and would not have been possible without the digital link.

### Online Safety project

A 20-week digital workshop for people with additional needs, sensory needs and mental health conditions was created to help keep them confident and safe online. The workshops and content were designed with user feedback



to accommodate the skills and the needs of the group.

Laptops, large screens, and accessible keyboards were purchased for the project. Two individuals with firsthand experience volunteered to help in the workshops and gained confidence in supporting others with their technological expertise.

#### The workshops covered:

- · Familiarising participants with their equipment
- Teaching basic computer skills and internet safety in two groups: beginners and advanced learners
- Users created comic strips about internet safety
- · Learning how to create a podcast

As a legacy, the Comic Strips and Easy Reads will be compiled into a book and distributed to organisations in the Forest of Dean and in the future the group plans to explore further work on internet safety and podcasting to reach more organisations and individuals.
