



Volunteers are also needed to stay on site when required, to act as wardens, staff reception, clean and act as the point of contact for visiting groups.







Forestry England

We have a variety of volunteering roles available, including:

- Ecology monitoring surveying for reptiles, amphibians, River-fly, butterflies and habitat.
- Practical conservation and outdoor teams managing habitat for key species, bracken, and scrub clearance. This includes the Dean Green Team (who meet on a Tuesday all year round).
- Arboretum volunteers (the first Thursday of every month).
- Forest Waters volunteers (the third Thursday of every month).
- Beaver Fence Checkers a rota of volunteers who regularly check the beaver enclosures perimeter fence.



- Visitor Service Assistants involving helping at local recreation sites, trail inspections, litter picking, fence checking, communication with visitors and manning information points.
- **Community Litter Picks** throughout the Forest and support for individual litter pickers to collect from their chosen FE area.
- Active Forest helping events, activities and groups that might need additional support.



Become a Local Councillor

Local Government needs people from all backgrounds and experiences who reflect the communities they serve to put themselves forward for election.
